GPC England meeting

GPC England held its meeting on Thursday 17 January. The following issues were discussed at the meeting:

- Contract negotiations
- Received: GP partnership review
- Received: NHS Long Term plan update

This meeting was chaired by the speaker of GPC England, Dr Fay Wilson.

The majority of the meeting was taken up by an update and discussion about the current GP contract negotiations. The committee also received an update from Dr Nigel Watson, independent chair of the <u>GP partnership review report</u>, which was published on 15 January by the Department of Health and Social Care (England) in collaboration with NHS England, GPC and RCGP. GPC welcomed this report which addresses the issues of risk, workload, workforce and status in the system, and identifies the major problems as being about resources, implementation and delivery. The committee also received a presentation by Dr Nikki Kanani (Acting Director of Primary Care) and Dominic Hardy (Director of Commissioning) from NHS England regarding its <u>long-term plan for the NHS</u> which was launched last week. The plan sets out its vision for the future direction of the NHS and lays out ambitious aims for the health service linked to an expansion in digital services and a focus on preventive care. The previously announced £3.5bn for primary medical care and community services has been increased to £4.5bn. There is also an important and clear commitment to increase the proportion of NHS investment spent on primary medical and community services.

The next meeting of GPC England will take place on Thursday 16 May 2019 and the next GPC UK will take place on Thursday 21 March 2019.

The Department of Health and Social Care has responded to the consultation on changes to the Human Medicines Regulation 2012 to ensure the continuity of supply of medicines and published the <u>Statutory Instrument</u> and explanatory memorandum.
