Colestid® (colestipol) orange and plain 5g granules sachets

Tier 2 – medium impact* Date of issue: 26/2/2021

Summary

- Colestid® Orange sachets are out of stock until the end of May 2021.
- Colestid® Plain sachets are out of stock with a resupply date to be confirmed.
- Other bile-acid sequestrants remain available.
- Supplies of unlicensed imports of colestipol sachets have been sourced.

Actions Required

For patients with insufficient supplies, clinicians should consider:

- prescribing an alternative bile-acid sequestrant (see UKMi memo for further information); or
- prescribing unlicensed colestipol sachets if alternative medicines are not appropriate. Prescribers should work with pharmacy teams to ensure orders are placed within appropriate time frames as lead times may vary (see supporting information below).

- When prescribing a product that is not licensed in the UK due to a supply issue with the licensed alternative, prescribers must indicate on the FP10 prescription that an unlicensed product is required. This can be done in one of the following two ways:
 - Electronic prescriptions if the required unlicensed product is shown on electronic prescribing systems, GPs should select:
 - Colestid[®] 5g sachets (imported)
